Faith Adventures. God's Light

THEME

Theme: Let Your Light Shine

This week helps children discover that the light of Jesus shines in them, through them, and around them. Each adventure invites young hearts to see God's goodness, and to share acts of kindness with open hands.



SCRIPTURE



"Let your light shine before others." Matthew 5:16

Invite your child to say the words slowly. Repeat the passage each day.

PRAYER

Jesus, thank you for filling our hearts with your light. Help us to see Your goodness all around us, and share your kindness with others. Guide our steps this week, so that our lives become lanterns of Your grace for others.



SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

- 14 "You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid.
- 15 No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house.
- 16 In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven. Matthew 5:14-16
- 1) What does it mean to shine your light before others?
- 2) How can our words carry God's light?
- 3) How can our actions show His love?

NATURE

Step outside and invite your child to notice:

- Something bright
- Something warm
- Something that catches the light
- Something that sparkles

Ask: "What do you think God is showing us?

End with a simple breath prayer: Inhale: Jesus, You are my light. Exhale: Shine through me.



CRAFT



Create a "Shine Your Light Lantern"

Materials:

Tissue Paper

Glass Jar

Glue

LED tea light

Stickers or markers

Steps:

- 1) Cover the outside of the jar with tissue paper
- 2) Add stickers or drawings of stars, hearts, or symbols of light.
- 3) Place a safe LED candle inside
- 4) Turn off the lights and watch your lantern glow

KINDNESS

Choose one way to shine Jesus' light this week:

- Draw a picture or write a letter to someone who needs encouragement
- Say something kind to a sibling, classmate, or friend
- Help with a chore without being asked
- Share a toy, treat, or game
- Hold the door for someone



Afterward, talk about how it felt to share your light with someone else.
